



## Terms and Conditions

Enlighten Your Research Global - 2015

Advanced Networking for International Research

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Enlighten Your Research Global 2015 (EYR-Global) is organized by AARNet, ACONet, DFN, ESnet, GÉANT Association, Internet2, Janet/Jisc, PIONIER (PSNC), REANNZ, RedIRIS, RNP, SURFnet and SURFsara.

### 1. Definitions

NREN:	National Research and Education Network
Organizing NRENS:	All NRENS listed above.
Program:	Enlighten Your Research Global (EYR-Global) 2015
EYR-Global Organizing Committee:	A team comprised of representatives from each NREN responsible for organizing the program.
Applicant:	Anyone who submits a draft proposal or anyone who is named in the draft proposal as a team member.
Team:	All the people mentioned as members/co-applicants in the submitted draft and/or final proposal.
Main applicant:	The team member that will be considered the administrative contact and will be responsible for communicating with the EYR-Global organizing



	committee, with other applicant institutions, and with all the members of the team, as defined in the draft and final proposals.
Co-applicant:	A co-applicant can be of any type, such as (but not limited to) research and industry partners, service providers, etc.
Network coordinator:	The team member assigned to this task is responsible for ICT and/or communication with the ICT department within their own institute. Every participating institute should provide and name one network coordinator. If a network connection is required, the network coordinator must be able to approve its establishment within the institutes involved.
Participating institute:	An institute is participating when people from that institute are team members mentioned in a submitted draft proposal.
Draft proposal:	The submitted first round proposal, based on the template made available on the program website.
Final proposal:	The proposal submitted in the second round of the application process, which only approved applicants from the first round are invited to submit.

## 2. Applicants and application teams

### First round – proposal draft

#### Applicant and team requirements:

- 1) **International project:** Each team must consist of a minimum of two researchers affiliated with different institutions in different participating countries.
- 2) **Main Applicant:**
  - a) Each team needs to assign one of their members as the main applicant. This member will be considered the administrative contact and will also be responsible for communication between the involved institutions.
  - b) The main applicant must be a researcher who takes part in the program on behalf of his or her institution.
  - c) The main applicant must be affiliated with a research institution that is connected to the Organizing NREs (as listed above) or affiliated NREs. Visit the webpage 'About - Partners' on the website for this information.
- 3) **Co-applicants:** Co-applicants can be of any type, such as (but not limited to) research and industry partners, service providers and so forth. Co-applicants from the private sector



may – in the scope of the program, but only for the objectives set out in their (draft) proposal – use the network services offered by the organizing NREs, if feasible.

4) **Network coordinator:** For the draft proposal, it is sufficient to include one network coordinator in the team, however, more than one may participate (and is appreciated). If a network connection is involved, the network coordinator must be able to approve its establishment within all the involved institutions.

5) **Other:**

- All team members – including the network coordinator(s) – need to give their (written) approval to the draft proposal.
- Teams may submit multiple proposals.
- Several teams from the same institute can participate, provided each team submits a separate proposal.

### Second round – the final proposal

- 1) Only teams with approved draft proposals from the first round will be asked to submit a final proposal.
- 2) As with the first round proposal, each team must include at least one network coordinator. If a network connection is involved, the network coordinator must be able to approve its establishment within all the involved institutions.
- 3) Likewise, all team members – including the network coordinator(s) and the institution coordinator(s) – need to give their (written) approval to the final proposal.

### 3. Submission details

- Draft proposals must be submitted using the template on the website [www.enlightenyourresearch.net](http://www.enlightenyourresearch.net). The applicants will receive e-mail confirmation of their submission.
- The deadline for submission of the draft proposal is June 7, 2015.

### 4. Application process

- The application process consists of two rounds:
  - \* The first round consists of everyone who has submitted a draft proposal using the template on the website. The awarded proposals go through to the second round.
  - \* The second round consists of an elaboration of the proposal resulting in a final proposal.
- The subject of the proposal can be chosen freely and may involve any field of research.
- The draft and final proposals must adhere to the guidelines described in the *Call for proposals* and the *Submission guidelines* that can be found, along with other document templates, on the website under the heading 'How to submit'.
- Both the draft proposal and the final proposal should be submitted in English.
- Applicants retain the intellectual property rights to their proposal.



- A consultation team from the organizing NRENs will contact the qualified candidates of the first round and their ICT department(s) to discuss the technical, organizational and financial feasibility of the proposal. The outcomes of this discussion should be incorporated into the final proposal.
- Further guidelines and criteria for elaborating the proposals in the second round will be communicated to the main applicant upon approval of the first round proposal.
- As part of the final proposal, the institutions of the participating researchers must ensure the availability of the required local infrastructure and facilities and moreover ensure their cooperation in integrating the awarded services.
- The EYR-Global organizing committee reserves the right to use the awarded proposals for publicity and promotion via different media channels. The awarded teams will cooperate with the Organizing NRENs on publicity and communications and will act as ambassadors for e-Infrastructure services as demonstrated in their proposal, for example by giving presentations at conferences or taking part in interviews.

## 5. The selection procedure

- The selection procedure consists of two stages.
  - \* In the first round, the selection committee reviews all draft proposal submissions and compiles a shortlist of the proposals that proceed to the next round.
  - \* In the second round, the selection committee will choose the final proposals.
- Representatives of the organizing NRENs will form the selection committee.
- The qualified candidates from the first round will be notified no later than June 16, 2015.
- Entries that did not make the second round will receive a notification shortly after June 16, 2015.
- Teams that qualified to the second round must submit the final proposal no later than September 1, 2015.
- Teams that agree to submit their final proposal are obliged to provide the consultation team with the necessary information to determine the technical, organizational and financial feasibility of the proposal. The outcomes of discussions with the consultation team should be incorporated into the final proposal.
- The awarded projects will be announced in October/November 2015 (the exact date will be announced on the website).
- Implementation and integration of the awarded services and/or support will start in 2016.

## 6. Awarded services or resources

- The awarded teams receive the following services:
  1. High-performance network infrastructures operated by the participating NRENs and their partners;
  2. Support and consultation with expert network engineers on devising the best end-to-end network connectivity plan to support the proposed research;



3. Commitment from each participating NREN to an agreed level of network resource provisioning and ongoing support during the program duration;
4. The required network connection will be delivered to the NREN termination point at the institution (if present). The institution is responsible for extending the connection within the institution and for the required infrastructure.

## 7. Project selection procedures

- In principle, the EYR-Global organizing committee will correspond only with the main applicant, via e-mail and/or telephone. He/she needs to ensure that he/she can be contacted through an operational e-mail address, which should be made known to the EYR-Global organizing committee.
- The EYR-Global organizing committee will appoint a selection committee and will determine and undertake a diligent and transparent proposal selection.
- The selection committee acts in good faith in granting the awards, and reserves the right not to grant awards.
- Decisions made by the EYR-Global organizing committee regarding the interpretation of these terms and conditions and the awarding decisions are binding and final.

## 8. Disclaimer

- The participating teams are responsible for the content and nature of their submission to the EYR-Global program.
- The participating teams are responsible for ensuring that no legal obligations, no rules of public order or decency and no rights of third parties are violated, according to the laws of the countries involved. They must also ensure that their submission results in no unlawful act and/or in no damage to others. Teams indemnify the organizing NRENs from any and all costs and damages that could result from infringing on these and other obligations.
- No rights can be derived from suggestions and instructional materials provided by the organizing NRENs regarding the EYR-Global program.
- Under certain unforeseen circumstances, the organizing NRENs reserve the right to change the terms and conditions of the program at any time. The latest version of this document can be found on the website.
